## Change the Welcome Mat for 2017 — Pastor Travis

Dear friends in Christ,

Just last month I bought a new welcome mat! The old one lasted 8 years. Yet now, instead of welcoming people, the welcome mat was tracking itself into the house. The welcome mat was no longer cleaning shoes but putting dirt on them. The welcome mat no longer said, "Welcome!" but "This family is cheap and does not care about you!" So I went to Walmart, Kohls, Shopko and a few other stores and finally found a new one to welcome guests! It makes our entry look like we care again!

Our church looks much like our welcome mat: over time, physically and spiritually, we begin to run ragged. Just think of all the 2016 events held in Calvary's church building: Circle Bible Studies, Late Night Youth Lock-ins, Counseling Appointments, Board Meetings, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, Worship Services, Sunday School, Rummage Sale, Cookie Walk, WNAC, Confirmation and Outreach events, just to name a few. Plus, we had families use the parish hall for all sorts of extras – Basketball, elections, and even baby showers! Most all were done because we love Jesus! Yet, even despite all the good going on in the church family, the carpet wears out. We think we are welcoming, but the reality is the welcome is worn out!

The change of the New Year is a good time for us to reflect and ask are we worn out? How do we look to our neighbors? How do I look to my chil-

dren? How do I look to fellow Christians? It is time to change the welcome mat for 2016! This is done with Jesus washing away our sins and starting anew! Instead of doing everything from attending every game and every family gathering because I must, instead ask, "Lord Jesus, how might I best be your forgiven and redeemed servant? How might you use me most effectively?" Sometimes, we think more is better! The truth is that sometimes God can use us in one or two areas most effectively. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

The beginning of a new year is also a time for change. I find myself making a resolution every year, which usually involves trying to improve myself in some way. *How many of you do a New Year's Resolution?* A common resolution at New Year's is to lose weight and improve fitness. There are various ways people seek to reach that goal. Some strive to improve their diet, either eating smaller portions or switching to healthier foods. Others focus more on exercise, building up their strength or following a cardio workout plan. Picking any or all of those options can help a person reach a weight loss and fitness goal.

There is a certain goal, however, that has only one way to reach it. If the goal that you want to ob-

tain is eternal life in heaven, the one and only way to reach that goal is through Jesus. Jesus is the world's one and only Savior.

Many people in the world disagree with that. The common thought is that there are many ways to reach the goal of heaven and eternal life. Many consider Jesus to be one option of many.

Your support through prayer, volunteering, and donating ensures that the starving children of the world receive nourishing food and hear about our Lord Jesus.

January begins a new packaging year for Mercy Meals of Siouxland. We have 12 regular events scheduled and 2 special events scheduled in January.

Update:

Saturday November 5 we shipped 69,552 packaged meals back to Orphan Grain Train and received more materials to package meals. We have begun purchasing 50 lb. bags of rice at Sam's Club in Sioux City using Thrivent Action Team seed money to pay for the rice. The rice costs less and the bags are more securely sewn.

On Saturday November 19, fifty-one volunteers packaged 22,074 Mercy Meals. The following groups participated: Northwestern College women's track team, Scout Troop 114, Sioux City, and Paula Opal with four others from Council Bluff/Omaha. This was the last scheduled event this year.

Due to scheduling conflicts with the parish hall at Faith, we did not package in December.

Throughout 2016, we packaged 246,264 Mercy Meals for hungry & starving children in the U.S. and worldwide all paid for with donations and a grant from Iowa West LWML. We have packaged 1,053,083 Mercy Meals since we began packaging on June 23, 2012. A huge thank you goes out to all of our prayer partners, volunteers, donors, supporters, and individuals who have submitted Thrivent Action Team Projects for Mercy Meals.

We wish each of you a blessed Christmas and we hope to see you in 2017.

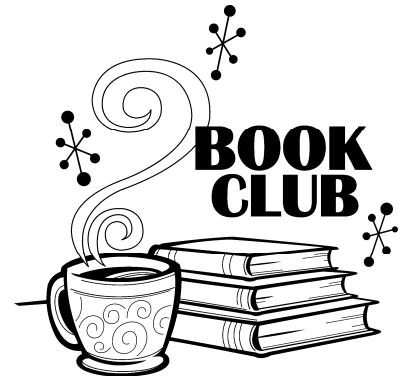
